September got incredibly busy for us even though our schools campaign was on vacation with the kids. The staff of Nigeria Television Authority (NTA) were benefitted as we took our services to their Headquarters.



The women of the political party PDP invited us to cater to their members as they launched a new program. We benefitted 163 persons and rescued a young man who went into an epileptic fit.



Our CEO, Adanma Odefa was invited by Afro-European Medical Research Network which DHS is a member of to present a paper at their annual symposium in Bern, Switzerland. This she of course did with great finesse and represented DHS optimally, lending our voice to the advocacy of better health for low income countries and maximal diaspora participation in healthcare.

On the 27th, DHS was invited by Nigeria Tourism Development Commission to champion their Health Tourism arm of their World Tourism Day celebrations. It was a complete success. 340 people benefitted from free blood sugar, blood pressure checks, doctors consulted and free medication were given out to members of the public for various ailments including high blood glucose, anemia, malaria etc. It was a wonderful surprise to see the tourism commission so passionate and committed to public health. Finally, it was back to the schools for us as we resumed our Young People's Health project targeting Secondary Schools. Our first beneficiaries this school year was Government Secondary School, Gwarimpa where 244 kids received free health checks and the entire school population benefitted from our health promotion teachings.

We happily concluded the month of September with a total beneficiaries base of 798 persons!

Dear people, Egbe Blessing (sickle cell anemia) one of our two special young girls, whom we met in June during our Ebonyi state village clinics have been benefitted by a large hearted benefactress. Bless her kind heart. Alieke Blessing (type 1 diabetes) is still very much in need of your help.
